We continue to work to achieve this through school announcements, purchase of classroom resources that reflect underrepresented communities, ...

Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

To celebrate OCSGE, we as a school community acknowledge the efforts of all our students regularly. Teachers are encouraged to incorporate the OCSGE in their report card comments as well. Each classroom has the elementary version of the OCSGE and teachers are encouraged to refer to them often. During their long-range planning, teachers also consider opportunities to highlight the expectations throughout the curriculum. Our grade 8 graduation awards will include recognition of student who demonstrate the OCSGE on a regular basis at St. Albert of Jerusalem.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

St. Albert of Jerusalem Catholic School supports practices and activities that align with the Dufferin-Peel CDSB MYSP by focusing on student, parent and community focused events that are rooted in the respect for members of our Catholic community. This year, our mission is to ensure that equity is present within our school, as well as to provide opportunities for students that are based in the fundamental principle that every student should have the opportunity to succeed personally and academically, regardless of background, identity, or personal circumstances. Some of these opportunities will include:

Child and Youth Worker/Social Worker programs – promoting healthy interactions between peers and connecting families with community-based resources, programs and supports. Progressive Discipline – Ensuring that student actions that do not meet School and Board behaviour expectations are addressed through a Catholic lens of empathy, accountability, and support. Our decision making is grounded in the Catholic Social teachings that promote and elevate human dignity for all.

We value and encourage the contribution and cooperation of all the St. Albert of Jerusalem Catholic School community members in the achievement of all our goals.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

The Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario notes that "Catholic schools have a unique opportunity to show young people the way to that high ground; to accompany students in the search for truth; to foster in them a thirst for justice and an appreciation of the goodness of God, leading them patiently and lovingly in their journey of faith." Faith formation and its integration into curriculum, environment and climate provide the foundation of our school district. St. Albert of Jerusalem Catholic School displays several visible signs of our faith. Upon entry into the school space is grounded with a large cross and altar. The Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations are displayed on the wall with children from the school community reflected in the pictures. Additionally, a large photo display in the form of a cross marks the entrance to the foyer where Mother Mary the focal point. Each classroom has a prayer space and cross. Additionally, visible signs of our Faith are evident in the daily actions and faces of our students and staff.

St. Albert of Jerusalem Catholic School has recently established a prayerful gathering space in the lower-level forum of the school. Church pews, a large cross and a statue of Mother Mary provide visible symbol that the space is distinct from the rest of the school.
